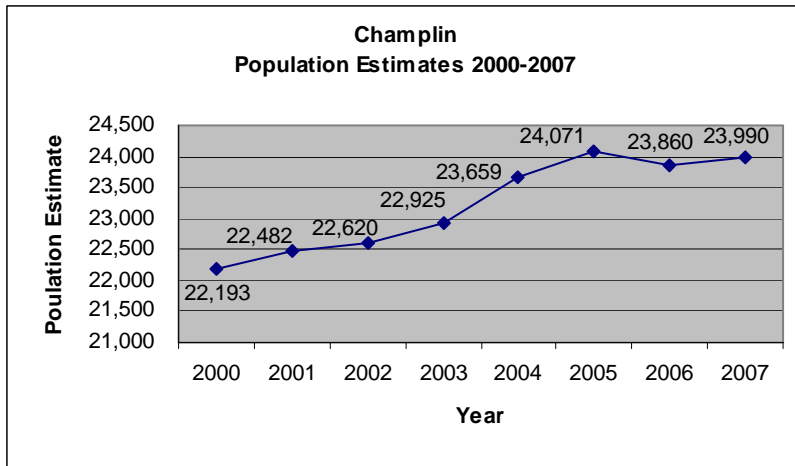

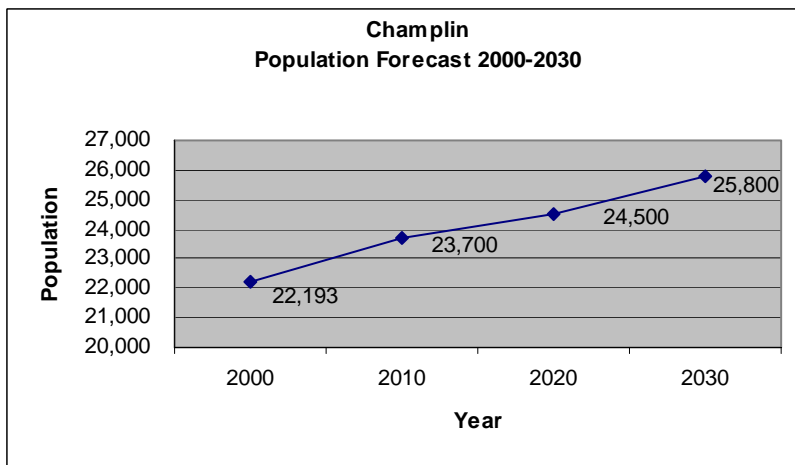


## Population



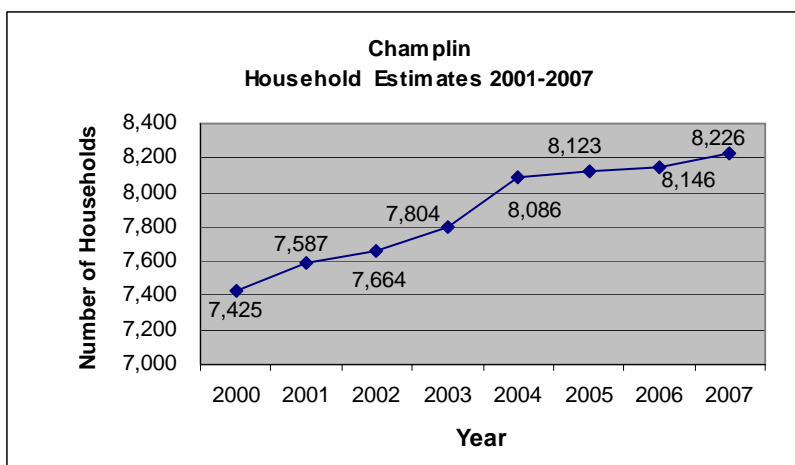
The most recent estimated population of Champlin (2007) was 23,990, an 8% increase since 2000. Champlin is the fifth largest city in the Northwest Hennepin Region.

The population in Champlin is projected to increase to 23,700 by 2010, almost a 7% increase since 2000. The population is projected to continue to increase to 24,500 by 2020, and to 25,800 by 2030.

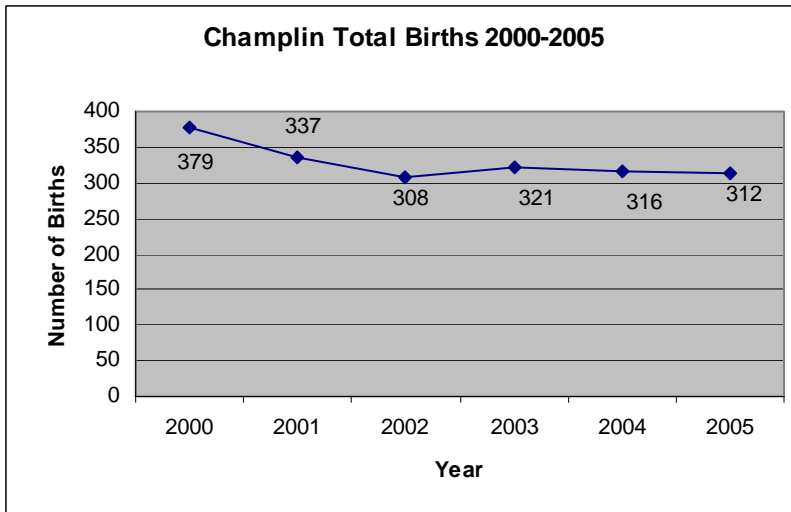

There were an estimated 8,226 households in Champlin in 2007, an 8% increase since 2001.

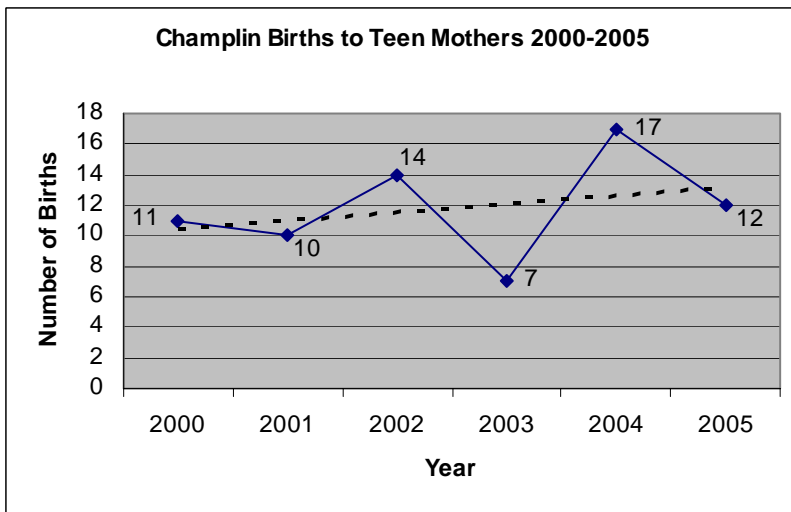

## Natality



There was a total of 312 births in Champlin in 2005, a decline of 17% since 2000. There was an average of 329 births per year in Champlin between 2000 and 2005.

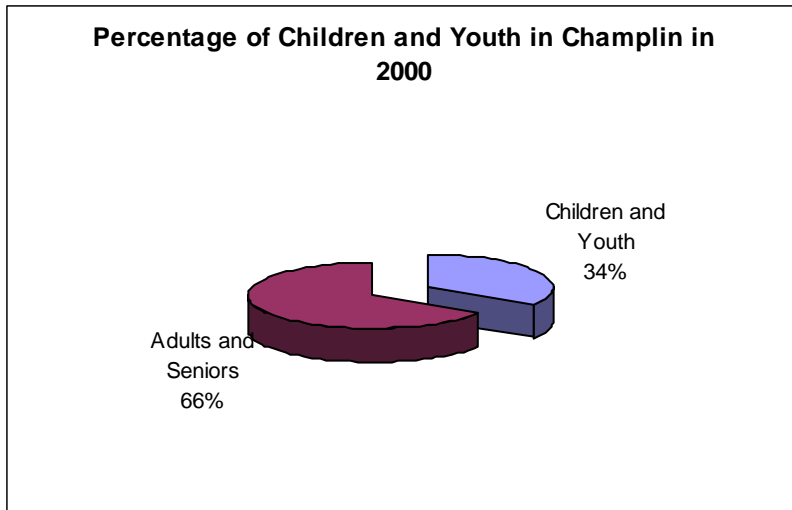


In 2005, 12 Champlin teenagers gave birth, representing 3% of the total births in the city. This marked a 9% increase in births to teenage mothers since 2000, as can be seen with the dotted trend line. At the same time, the 2005 teen birth rate also marked a 29% decrease from 2004, when births to teenage mothers in Champlin were at their highest for the five-year period. An average of 12 teenagers per year gave birth in Champlin between 2000 and 2005.

## Children and Youth



In 2000, there were 7,447 children and youth 17 and under in Champlin. Slightly more than one-third (34%) of the population of Champlin was under the age of 18 in 2000.

In the year 2000 in Champlin, children and youth 17 years and under were primarily White (93.2%), and the largest minority populations were of children and youth who were Asian or Pacific Islander (2.1%) and Black or African American (2.0%).

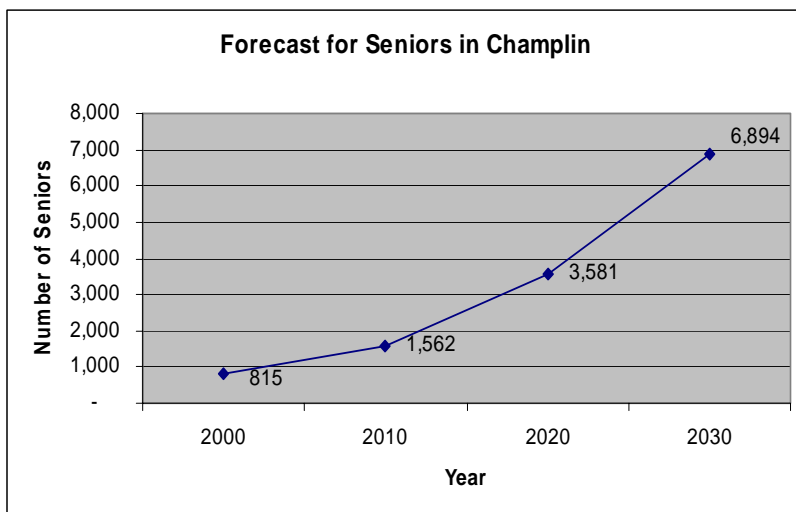

According to the Metropolitan Council, the senior population in Champlin in 2010 is projected to be 1,562, an increase of 88% since 2000.

The senior population is projected to increase to 3,581 in 2020 and to 6,894 in 2030.

## Race, Ethnicity and Language

Champlin is home to many people from diverse backgrounds, including immigrants and refugees. It is difficult to accurately estimate non English-speaking populations, in part because many members of these communities were born in the U.S. and are native English speakers. While data on primary home languages cannot provide an exact count of the number of immigrants in a city, it does provide a tool to estimate the size of immigrant communities and help locate these communities geographically.

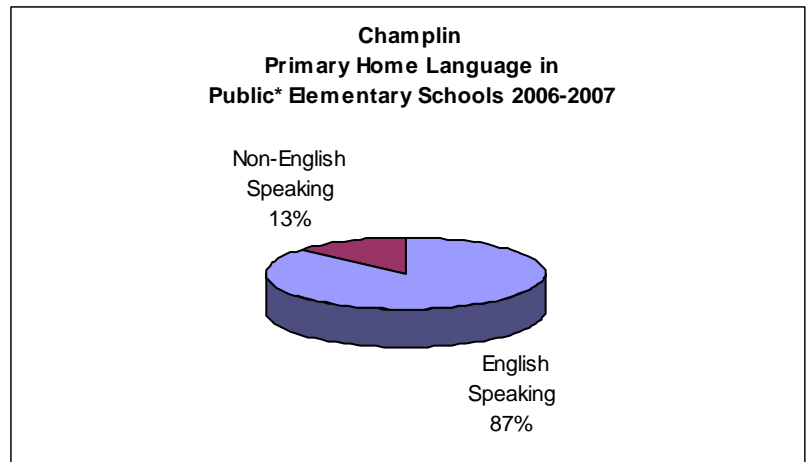

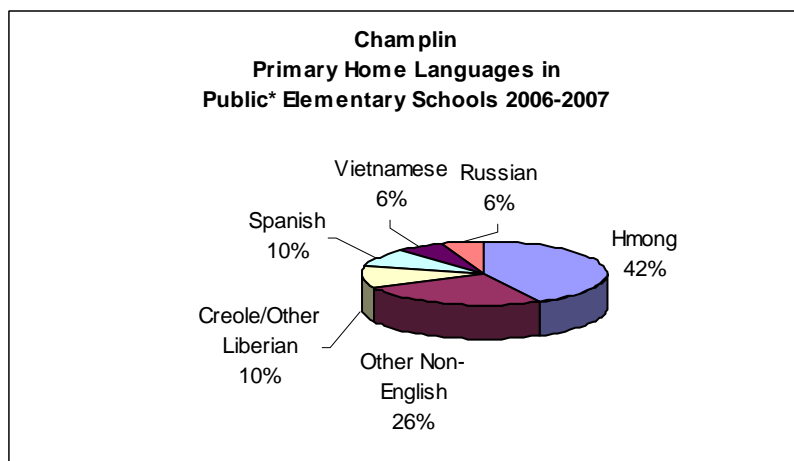

Champlin is served by the Anoka Hennepin school district in which 58 languages are spoken. Two public elementary schools are located in the city: Champlin Elementary and Oxbow Creek Elementary. In these two schools, 13% of the students reported speaking a language other than English at home during the 2006-2007 school year.

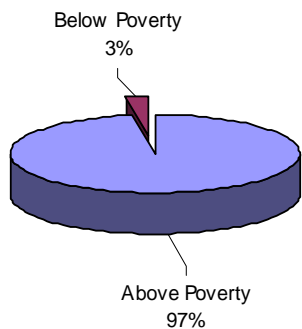

In Champlin during the 2006-2007 school year, most elementary school students who did not speak English at home reported speaking either Hmong, Creole or another Liberian language, or Spanish. Other languages spoken in Champlin included Vietnamese, Russian, Bengali, Croatian and Laotian.

**Population Below the Poverty Level in Champlin in 2000**

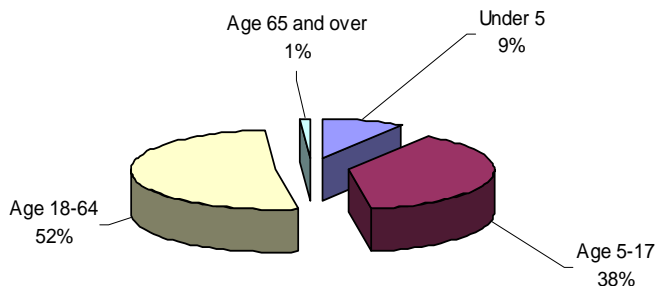


According to the 2000 Census, 562 people lived below the poverty level in Champlin, or 3% of the total population.

The federal poverty level in 2000 was \$17,604 for a family of four, and is currently \$21,200 for a family of four.

**Individuals Below the Poverty Level by Age in Champlin in 2000**

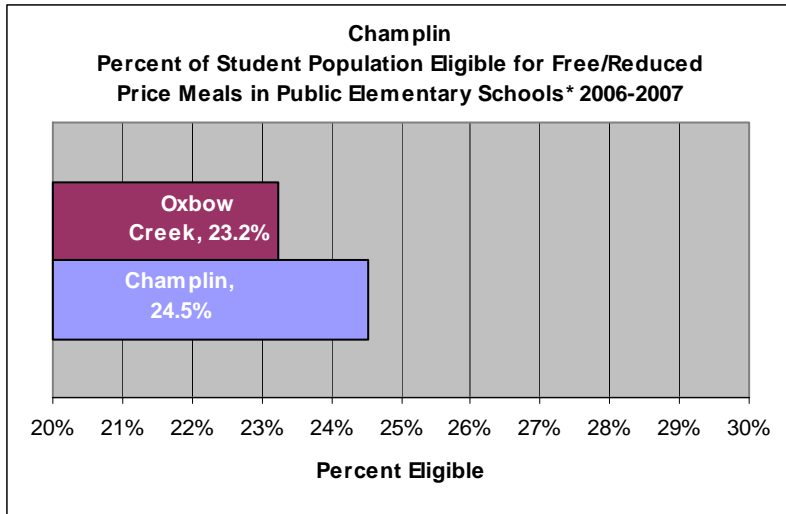


Of those living below the poverty level in Champlin in 2000, more than half (52%) were adults between the ages of 18 and 64, 38% were between the ages of 5 and 17, 9% were under the age of 5, and 1% were seniors.

**Poverty and Economic Assistance (continued)**



Eligibility for the Free and Reduced Price Meals Program is based on income; student's household income must be below 185% of the federal poverty level, currently \$21,200 for a family of four, to qualify for reduced-price meals and below 130% of poverty level for free meals.

Approximately a quarter of students were eligible for free and reduced price meals during the 2006-2007 school year at both public elementary schools in Champlin.

**Economic Assistance in Champlin**

As of November 2007, there were 627 households in Champlin receiving economic assistance from Hennepin County. Nearly all those households (97%) were families receiving health care, while about one-quarter of the household cases (26%) received food support (food stamps).

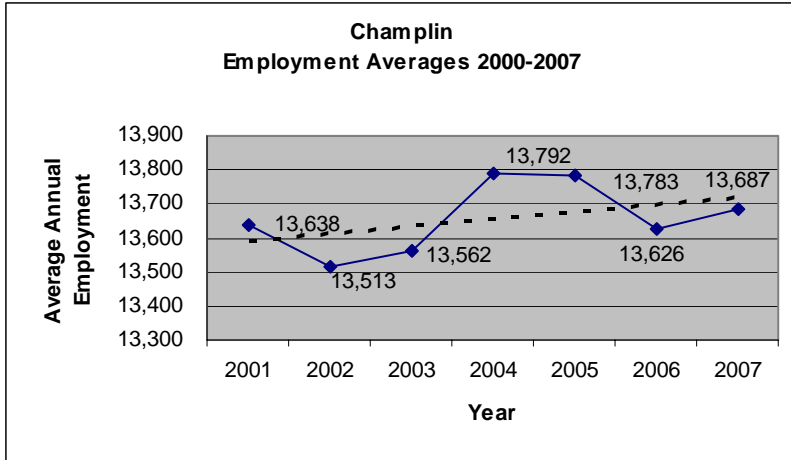

## Employment

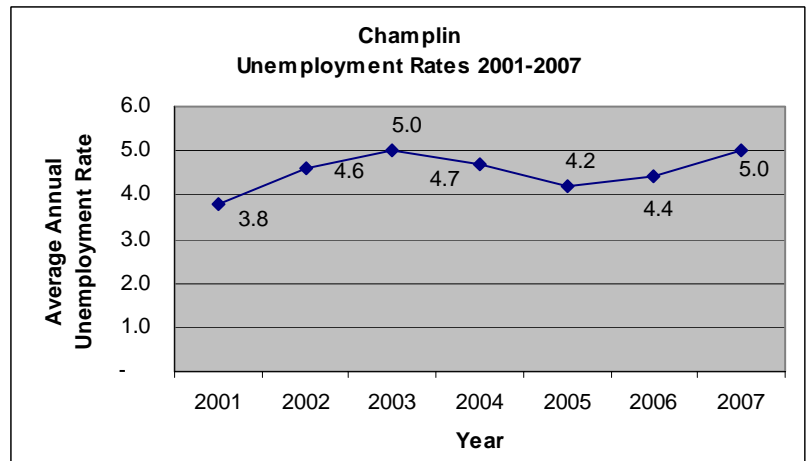
Employment statistics from the Minnesota Department of Employment and Economic Development are based on results from monthly surveys of households around the state conducted by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and the Census Bureau. Average employment is the average number of city residents who are employed for pay or who did 15 or more hours unpaid work for a family business during the survey week.



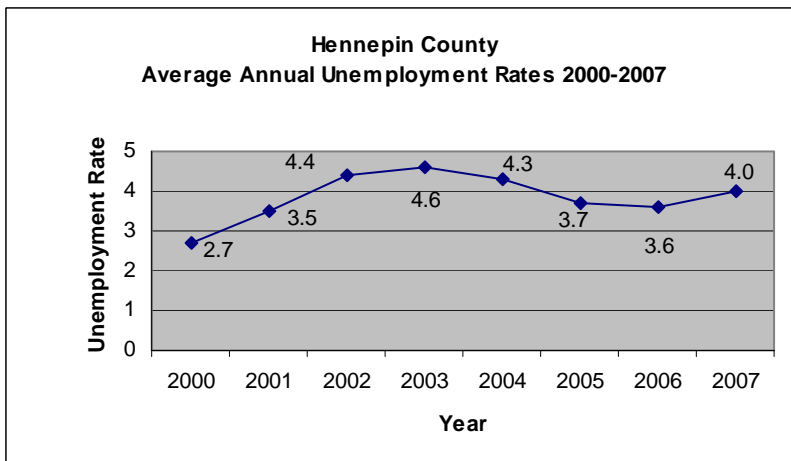
The average number of those employed (not seasonally adjusted) for 2007 in Champlin was 13,687. This represented a nominal increase of 0.4% percent since 2001, as seen in the dotted trend line.

The unemployment rate of a city is the percent of the city's labor force who do not have a job, have actively looked for work in the prior four weeks and are currently available for work. It does not include people who wanted and were available for work, and had looked for a job sometime in the past year but not in the past four weeks. The average unemployment rate (not seasonally adjusted) in Champlin was 5% in 2007, an increase of 32% since 2001.

In comparison to Champlin's unemployment rate, the average annual unemployment rate (not seasonally adjusted) in Hennepin County was 4% in 2007, an increase of 48% since 2000.

## Housing

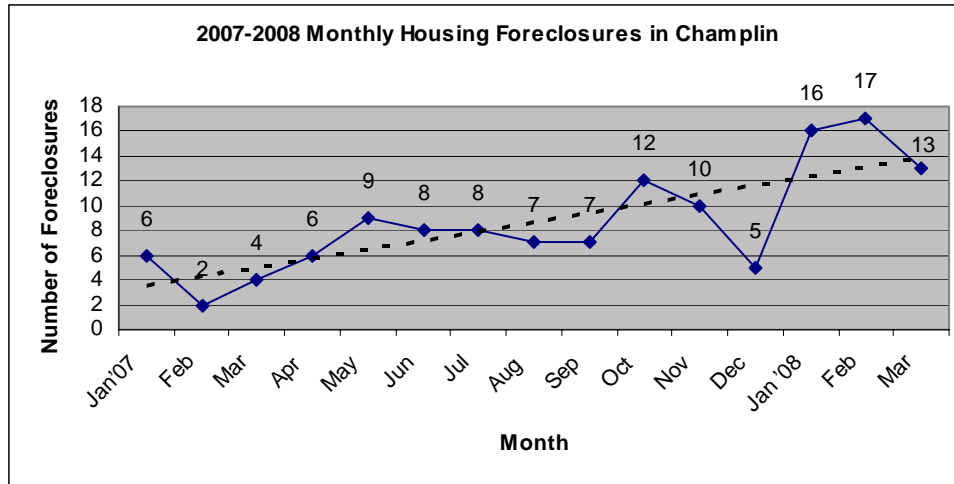
Housing sales in Champlin declined by almost 30% between 2006 and 2007, and average housing prices declined by close to 6%.
